## Jet Source provides five-star service as San Diego's elite charter aircraft service

Operating out of McClellan-Palomar Airport in Carlsbad, Jet Source, for the past 11 years, has provided the highest level of comfort, quality and safety for San Diego jetsetters.

Once simply a jet charter service, Jet Source has grown into a full-service Fixed Base Operation (FBO) with approximately 10 planes in its charter fleet,

an executive terminal, a FAA Diamond Award-winning avionics repair station, and a personalized aircraft management program.

Jet Source offers 120,000 square feet of hangar space and 35,000 square feet of office space in addition to the FBO.

"We're an all-in-one facility," said Jay Brentzel, Jet Source's chief pilot since June 2006.

With a worldwide certification, Jet Source's 20-25 pilots charter regular flights to more than 5,000 airports throughout the U.S. and Europe. Last year, Brentzel spent 10 days chartering a westbound flight around the world.

Each plane in the charter fleet includes amenities such as ovens, microwaves, satellite phones, fax machines, big comfortable seats, and DVD players.

But what keeps Jet Source a continued choice in the charter fleet industry is more than luxury, it's the company's commitment to safety.

Jet Source's operating standards exceed FAA requirements; it is the only San Diego company to earn an ARG/US Platinum aircraft charter safety rating.

Each Jet Source pilot, Brentzel said, undergoes yearly emergency drill training. All Jet Source crewmembers are simulator trained and assigned to no more than two aircraft types.

Just three weeks ago, Brentzel, who, with a degree in aviation has seven years experience as a chief pilot and has been flying out of Palomar Airport for 10 years, took a safety-training course at Flight Safety International Inc., in Savannah, Georgia.

Along with learning how to put out a fire in a plane's fuselage, Brentzel, in a simulator dunked in a pool, trained on how to land in water in case of an emergency similar to the US Airways flight that was successfully landed in the Hudson River on Jan. 15.

Doing its continued part to help the Rancho Santa Fe community, Jet Source will be supporting — as it did in 2006 and 2007 — the Rancho Santa Fe Community Center's Annual Spring Gala and donating a charter flight. For more information, visit [www.jetsource.com](http://www.jetsource.com).
